Certificate III in Sawmilling and Processing for timber graders

Workspace Training offers the *Certificate III in Sawmilling and Processing* (FPI30505) as a specialist timber grading program to personnel responsible for grading in a sawmilling or timber processing operation. The course is particularly suited to supervisors, production managers, quality control officers and leading-hand graders.

The units of competency for this qualification comprise 6 core units and 7 electives from the *Forest Products Industry Training Package* (FPI05). Note that other units are available under the packaging rules for FPI05, and are available by negotiation with Workspace Training.

The program is designed to be run in a series of modules at the participants' workplace, through on-the-job, off-the-job and distance learning modes. Extensive practice time will be allocated to grading different species of timber to a variety of specifications, including Australian Standards and enterprise standards.

Please note that the nominal hours shown above for each competency are an estimate only of the typical time required to complete the unit, including face-to-face training, on-the-job practice and assessment activities. The actual time taken will depend on the participant's level of experience and skill in that competency. Participants who can demonstrate existing skills to the level required will receive 'recognition of prior learning' (RPL) for those competencies.
